In the past months, I have participated in a youth psycho-social support training workshop, youth camp in the Northwestern District of Zambia (see back page), and have been accompanying a Youth Environmental Advocacy Project in the church. I am constantly encouraged by the dedication, openness, and energy youth embody in their lives and in the church.

I'm especially proud of the young adults who are leading the Youth Environmental Advocacy Project, or the "Umozi (one) Tree Planting Project." This is the first development project the youth of ELCZa have facilitated.

The Umozi project will work with one urban and one rural congregation. The Umozi Youth Team will host an environmental care and tree conservation workshop in each congregation. The congregations will then connect with schools and community organizations to host a community environmental education and indigenous tree-planting weekend.
