



- Confirm that the video volunteer showed up!
- Confirm that they know what they are doing!

- Greet those gathered offline and online
- Preach the sermon
- Count the number of online "viewers"
- **Q** Review the video and audio quality
- Hold a "training session" with the video volunteer
- **G** Find out they aren't available next Sunday
- **G** Find another volunteer for next Sunday


#### Sinek's Golden Circle



## Will hybrid ministry make us more missional and collaborative?






### Transition management insight

  - The 1998 Chicago Bulls' "Last Dance"




