## GATHERING

## PRAYER

## FOOTWASHING/HANDWASHING

## GOSPEL READING

The holy gospel according to John the 13th Chapter, Glory to you, O Lord.
The gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, O Christ.

## FOOTWASHING

Set out a out the bowl of water and towel for the handwashing or footwashing ritual. The host will provide additional instructions.

## PRAYER

We give you thanks, O Christ, for the gift of your presence in this place. In you we are loved, and through you we love one another. We ask that you to bless us the gifts of humility and compassion now and always. In your name we pray, Amen.

## BREAD BAKING

## SCRIPTURE READING

1 Corinthians 11:23-26
Word of God, Word of Life. Thanks be to God.

## BREAD BAKING

The host and gather people bake bread in their kitchens following the recipe on the supply list document. Remember to set a timer! Once the dough has been placed in the oven, all participants return to their electronic devices for the stripping of the altar.

## STRIPPING OF THE ALTAR

The Maundy Thursday experience concludes with the stripping of the altar. At this time, dim the lights in your home, and await instructions from the host.

## STRIPPING OF THE ALTAR

If you have created an altar in your home, you may dismantle it as the host reads Psalm 22. If there is a visible cross on your home altar, it may be veiled with a dark colored fabric.

Remain seated, observing silence.

Following the hearing of the passion, you may be seated. All the candles may be extinguished.

You may light the larger candle at this time as the host introduces the Vigil of Easter.

## Act III

Affirmation of Baptism

PRAYER

You have called us to yourself, enlightened us with the gifts of your Spirit, and nourished us in the community of faith. Uphold us and all your servants in the gifts and promises of baptism, and unite the hearts of all whom you have brought to new birth. We ask this in the name of Christ. Amen.

## PROFESSION OF FAITH

I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church.

Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God? I renounce them.
Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God? I renounce them.
Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God? I renounce them.

Do you believe in God the Father?
I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?
I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended to the death. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?

At this time, you may dip your fingers into the bowl of water and remember their baptism by making the sign of the cross either upon their forehead or across their body. If using anointing oil, you may anoint one another with the oil and remind one another that each person is a beloved child of God.

## SENDING

## PRAYER

God of steadfastness and encouragement, thank you for gathering us this night around these sacred stories. Grant that we may live in harmony with one another, filled with hope, joy and expectation. Now, nourished by your word, send us out into the world as bringers of your peace. Amen.

## DISMISSAL

Go in peace. Share the good news. Thanks be to God.

The host and gathered community may share time in fellowship and conversation by eating the baked bread and toasting with either champagne and/or non-alcoholic beverages. The community leave the Zoom session, as they feel led. Be sure to wash hands at the conclusion of Holy Week at Home.

## Easter Vigil

## Maundy Thursday

- Bibles
- Large Bowl
- Towels (5-8, depending on size)
- Bread Ingredients and Supplies (recipe found below)
- Home altar supplies
- Cross and dark colored fabric
- Computer, smart device or some other electronic means of accessing the Zoom session


## Bread Recipe

2 cups whole wheat flour
1 cup white flour
$11 / 4$ teaspoons baking powder
$11 / 4$ teaspoons salt
1 Tablespoon plus 1 teaspoon oil
$3 / 4$ cup hot water, plus 2 Tablespoons hot water
3 Tablespoons honey
3 Tablespoons molasses

Mix dry ingredients together. Cut in oil.
Combine water, honey and molasses; add to dry ingredients. Mix well. Dough will be a bit sticky.

Divide dough into four equal parts and roll each into a ball.
On a floured surface, roll each ball with a floured rolling pin, turning periodically and rolling into a $1 / 4$ inch thick circle.

Score/mark top of each circle with a knife into fourths (do not cut through the dough-just score the dough). If you wish, you can mark each quarter with a cross or some other design.

Bake at 350 degrees for 15-18 minutes. ( You may remove the bread from the oven after 10 minutes and brush with oil for a uniform look.
Recipe makes 4 half-pound loaves.

## Good Friday

- Tapered candles (one per person)
- Large bowl filled with sand for candles
- Matches or lighter
- Large white candle
- Tapered candles (one per person; previously used for the Good Friday experience)
- Large bowl filled with sand for candles
- Matches or lighter
- Computer, smart device or some other electronic means of accessing the Zoom session
- Large bowl filled with water
- Anointing oil (olive oil works well) applied to a cotton ball
- Champagne or other non-alcoholic beverages
- Cups for beverages
